CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. SEARLS

- Q. Don't you consider the actual monitoring to be more accurate than predictions made prior to the reentry"?
 - A. No, 1 think —
- Q. Answer yes or no. MR. YANNACONE: I am going to object unless the question can be answered yes or no.
- A. No.
- Q. [By Mr. Searls] In other words, you think predictions made prior to reentry can be more certain than monitoring that might take place after the venting to the air?
 - A. I didn't say they would be more certain. I say that we must have predictions that we can have some confidence in as part of the assurance that monitoring will be satisfactory.
- Q. Can monitoring he made more certain than predictions made prior to the reentry"?

A. Certainly, but it is after the fact.
